

## BUILDING EARLY LITERACY SKILLS OVER THE SUMMER

Michelle's Corner: Easy things you can do to help your child read:

- Reading aloud to your child for 15 minutes a day will help grow their vocabulary and promote healthy brain development.
- Singing and dancing is a great way to bond with your child, and it's fun!
- Have your child become a publisher. Ask them to draw a picture and tell you about a time or place. You do the same, drawing a picture and writing back to them about a special moment in your life.
- Take a walk around the neighborhood and talk about the different signs and what they mean. Ask if your child can pick out different letters.
- Play "Simon Says." It's the perfect game to address a variety of skills to help with your child's development, from body awareness to sequence skills to following (and giving) directions.

## **MILESTONES MATTER**

Download the CDC Free Milestone Tracker app

Milestones matter! And for the first time in nearly 20 years, the CDC and American Academy of Pediatrics have updated developmental milestones in children. The revisions are meant to give more specific guidelines and clearer benchmarks for both families and pediatricians. That's important so teams of medical experts can identify developmental delays

Track your child's milestones from 2 months to 5 years old with the CDC's free, easy-to-use and illustrated checklists. Get tips about encouraging your child's development and find out what to do if you are concerned about how your child is developing.





#### LET'S GET READY FOR KINDERGARTEN!

There are many ways you, as parents and parenting adults, can help prepare your child for the transition to kindergarten. What you do and how you treat others sets the model your child will follow. If you approach learning as challenging and worthwhile, your child will too.

#### Register your child for kindergarten

Visit the Escambia County School District enrollment portal to register your child for kindergarten at https://ecsd-fl.schoolloop.com/focusenrollment. You will need to complete and submit an online enrollment application either at home or at your child's school.

#### **BRING TO THE SCHOOL:**

- Proof of address
- If the school you are attempting to enroll is NOT your residentially zoned school, you must also have School Choice approval prior to enrolling at the school.
- Physical within past 12 months
- Immunization records
- Verification of age (such as a birth certificate)
- Social security number (optional)

#### **JUDY'S TIPS**

You can use everyday activities to help your child gain the skills and abilities that will set them up for success.

- Encourage independence by allowing your child to choose clothes or pour milk from a small container into a cup.
- Ask your child to help with simple household chores.
- Read picture books with more complex stories, sing favorite songs and work simple puzzles together.
- Encourage your child to sort and classify by pairing the socks as you sort the laundry, spotting all blue cars on the way home from the grocery store, or sorting pictures from old magazines and catalogs.
- Encourage pretend play by providing inexpensive props — old boxes can be taped shut to become building blocks; junk mail can be used to play post office.
- Continue to TALK, TALK, TALK to your child about EVERYTHING!

Remember, you are your child's most important teacher.



- 1. Child's birth certificate
- 2. Proof of Residency (any bill with address or lease)
- 3. Proof of family income ( child support, financial aid, W-2's or tax returns, and 2 current paystubs)

#### If Applicable

- Proof of public assistance (SSI/TANF documents)
- Guardianship paperwork
- · Proof of Medicaid or health insurance
